School Psychologist \$40.10 Investigate processes of learning and teaching and develop psychological principles and techniques applicable to educational problems.

Education Administrator – Elementary & Secondary \$50.26

Plan, direct or coordinate the academic, administrative or auxiliary activities of public or private elementary or secondary level schools.

Educational, Guidance, School, and Vocational Counselor \$29.60 Counsel individuals and provide group educational and vocational guidance services.

Speech-Language Pathologist \$39.61 Assess and treat persons with speech, language, voice, and fluency disorders. May select alternative communication systems and teach their use. May perform research related to speech and language problems.

CAREER PATHS IN EDUCATION



Elementary School Teacher \$65,780

Teach students basic academic, social, and other formative skills in public or private schools at the elementary level.

Secondary School Teacher \$64,806

Teach students in one or more subjects, such as English, mathematics or social studies at the secondary level in public or private schools. May be designated according to subject matter specialty.

Special Education Teacher – Kindergarten & Elementary \$64,203 Teach elementary school subjects to educationally and physically handicapped students. Includes teachers who specialize and work with audibly and visually handicapped students as well as those who teach basic academic and life processes skills to the mentally impaired.

ASSOCIATE'S DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE

Licensed Practical and Licensed Vocational Nurse \$24.41 Care for ill, injured or convalescing patients or persons with disabilities in hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, private homes, andusimilar institutions. May work under the supervision of a registered nurse. Licensing required.

Secretary and Administrative Assistant, Except Legal, Medical, and Executive \$23.80 Perform routine clerical and administrative functions such as drafting correspondence, appealutingnts, organizing and maintaining paper and electronic files or providing information to callers.

HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA OR GED AND/OR EXPERIENCE/ON-THE-JOB TRAINING

Bus Driver, School or Special Client \$19.66 Transport students or special clients, such as the elderly or persons with disabilities. Ensure adherence to safety rules. May assist passengers in boarding or exiting. Cook – Institution and Cafeteria \$19.08 Prepare and cook large quantities of food for institutions, such as schools, hospitals or cafeterias. Welding, Soldering, and Brazing Machine Setters, Operators, and Tenders \$24.65 Set up, operate, or tend welding, soldering, or brazing machines or robots that weld, braze, solder, or heat treat metal products, components, or assemblies.

Teacher Assistant \$38,871
Perform duties that are instructional in nature or deliver direct services to students or parents. Serve in a position for which a teacher has ultimate responsibility for the design and implementation of educational programs and services.
